- Total projected revenue for 2025 revised to RM12.1 billion.

#### **Economic Performance**

#### Federal Funding for Sarawak State

This bar graph highlights rising federal support for Sarawak across 2022-2026. Development allocations grew steadily from RM2.9 billion to RM6 billion, underscoring stronger investment in state infrastructure. Special Grants expanded markedly from RM0.016 billion to RM0.6 billion. signalling increased federal responsibility and MA63-driven fiscal adjustments to strengthen Sarawak's development trajectory.


#### Sarawak's GDP Rate

The graph highlights Sarawak's performance from 2021 to 2026. After rising from 3.2% in 2021 to 6.9% in 2022, growth moderated to 1.3% in 2023 and rebounded to 3.9% in 2024. Forecasts indicate sustained momentum, with GDP expected at 4.5-5.0% in 2025 and 5.0-6.0% in 2026.

#### Sarawak Annual Growth FY 2021-2025 (RM Billion)

The bar chart shows Sarawak's steady economic expansion, with GDP rising from RM131.6 billion in 2021 to RM148.2 billion in 2024. Growth is expected to continue, reaching RM155.6 billion in 2025 and RM164.9 billion in 2026, supported by stronger investments. domestic demand, and PCDS 2030 initiatives.


#### Federal Funding for Sarawak State FY2022-2026



## **Economic Performance (Cont'd)**

#### Sarawak's Inflation Rate

The graph shows a clear downward trend in Sarawak's inflation rate from 2021 to 2025. After peaking at 4.3% in 2022, inflation eased to 3.1% in 2023 and 2.4% in 2024. For 2025, inflation is projected to moderate further to around 1.5%, indicating improving price stability and a more balanced economic environment moving forward.



#### Sarawak's Unemployment Rate

The **Sarawak's unemployment trend** from 2021 to 2026, indicating overall stability with gradual improvements over time. The unemployment rate declined from 4.0% in 2021 to 3.1% in 2022, reflecting post-pandemic labour market recovery.

It then remained relatively steady, at 3.4% in 2023 and 3.3% in 2024, supported by continued economic activity and job creation. The rate is projected to remain steady within the range of 3.2% to 3.5% in 2026, reflecting a relatively resilient and balanced labour market.



#### Sarawak Labour Force Size

The **Sarawak's labour force size** from 2021 to the first quarter of 2025, reflecting steady growth before a correction in early 2025. The labour force expanded from 1.442 million in 2021 to 1.527 million in 2024, driven by higher participation and improved job market conditions.

In Q1 2025, the labour force registered 1.257 million, representing a measurement for the first quarter rather than the full year, as reported in the Budget Speech. Overall, the figures indicate a generally expanding workforce aligned with Sarawak's economic development momentum.

Expands electricity, water, roads, and public transport, prioritising equitable development for rural and remote communities.

Boosts food security, modern farming, agroparks, aquaculture, livestock and farmer support to strengthen Sarawak's agro-economy.



#### Investment, Industrialisation & SMEs

RM154.45 million

Supports SMEs, industrial parks and investment missions to stimulate economic diversification and job creation.



#### Environment, **Climate Change** & Forestry

RM118.66 million

Funds conservation, Net Zero initiatives, carbon studies, enforcement, and forest protection for a sustainable, low-carbon Sarawak.



#### Social Protection & Welfare

RM1.26 billion

Supports families, children, OKU, seniors, rental aid, food assistance and housing to strengthen social wellbeing and inclusivity.



#### **Federal Funding**

RM6 billion

Supports federal-led development projects including infrastructure, schools, utilities, health facilities and rural upgrades in Sarawak.



## **Revenue & Expenditure**

Sarawak's 2026 **total revenue** is projected at **RM13.1 billion**, comprising tax revenue mainly from SST, non-tax revenue from O&G compensation, dividends, land receipts, and federal grants.



 Total expenditure is RM12.9 billion, covering operating costs including personnel, services, grants, assets and others, alongside a substantial allocation to the Development Fund.



The 2026 Budget records a surplus of RM144 million, reflecting prudent financial management and the State's commitment to maintaining a stable fiscal position.



4. Development expenditure totals RM9.3 billion with 66% directed toward rural development to enhance infrastructure and community well-being.



## **Agriculture Sector Allocations**

A total of RM73 million supports agricultural modernisation, including the Sarawak Agrotechnology Park, Precision Farming Parks, the Metropolitan Food Cluster, and IoT applications to boost productivity.



 RM5.6 million is allocated for agriculture R&D to enhance crop innovation, improve farming techniques, and strengthen sector productivity.



**3.** RM21.4 million supports agroparks and aquaculture parks to expand agro-industry capacity, strengthen value chains, and boost rural-based agribusiness growth.



**4. RM79.4 million** strengthens **food security** through paddy and irrigation upgrades, drainage works, Mid Sadong rehabilitation, farmer assistance, and for the cattle industry.



RM34.2 million enhances agricultural infrastructure, including farm 5. road upgrades and improved collection and packaging centres to support efficient supply chains.



A total of RM67.2 million supports for farmers and fishermen in terms of crop development, promotion, mechanisation, 6. agro-entrepreneurship, fisheries and livestock to boost rural productivity.



RM270 million supports the agriculture facilitation fund, including 7. RM247 million in cumulative spending and RM50 million for the Jaya Tani assistance programme.



RM6.5 million strengthens Persatuan Peladang Negeri (PPN) and 8. Pertubuhan Peladang Kawasan (PPK) to improve services, coordination, and support for farmers.



## **Environment, Climate Change & Forestry**

Environmental efforts receive RM3.4 million for the Climate Change 1. Roadmap, RM7 million for Net Zero Strategy, and RM2.4 million for forest restoration programmes.



RM26.6 million supports environmental management including the 2. Bio Industrial Park, nutraceutical facility, forest management, NREB programmes, and enforcement technology.



Environmental conservation is strengthened through RM8.33 3. million in support for geoparks, wetlands, biodiversity work, forest research, and Al-based protection.



RM66.8 million supports conservation and Sarawak Forestry 4. Corporation (SFC) operations, strengthening Sarawak's protected areas and ensuring long-term protection of critical ecosystems.



## **Investment, Industrialisation & SMEs**

To strengthen Sarawak's **SME development**, **RM60.6 million** supports micro enterprises, skills training, and the establishment of 16 *Anjung Usahawan* centres statewide.



 RM60.85 million advances industrial park development across key divisions, including site preparation and impact assessments to attract investment and expand industrial capacity.



 RM33 million supports trade and investment promotion, including Invest Sarawak missions and the operations of Sarawak Trade and Tourism Offices in key regional hubs.



## Tourism, Culture & Eco-Tourism

Upgrading facilities, enhancing accessibility, and expanding key sites are the focus of the RM129 million allocation to strengthen Sarawak's tourism infrastructure.



To boost visitor arrivals and cultural visibility, RM194 million supports
events, agency grants, cultural sponsorships, research activities, and
other tourism promotion initiatives.



Strengthening conservation and sustainable tourism efforts, RM24
 million is channelled into eco-tourism and forestry programmes to protect Sarawak's natural environment.



## **Education & Human Capital**

RM250 million will be allocated in 2026 for the Free Tertiary Education Scheme (FTES), covering 64 undergraduate programmes 1. in partnership with state-owned universities and Yayasan Sarawak to expand access and strengthen talent development.



A RM36 million allocation strengthens international school operations, while RM13 million supports new campuses in Bintulu 2. and Miri, expanding capacity and enhancing global-standard education access.



Early childhood learning is boosted through RM40 million for 3. SeDidik improvements, special grants, and fee subsidies benefiting 4,000 young learners across Sarawak.



RM6 million strengthens the Dual Language Programme, while RM1 billion accelerates school rebuilding and RM20 million supports 4. Sarawak Education Enhancement Programme (SEEP) assistance for 63,000 students statewide.



RM115.5 million is allocated for comprehensive student support, including laptops, book vouchers, PTPTN aid, living assistance, and 5. Insentif Graduan Pulang Sarawak (i-GPS) flight subsidies to ease student costs.



Talent and TVET development receives RM157.7 million, covering the Talent Development Blueprint, Graduates Enhancement Training 6. Sarawak (GETS), TVET expansion, digital talent initiatives, and semiconductor training programmes.



## **Federal Funding**

Federal Budget 2026 allocation to Sarawak: RM6 billion (up from RM5.9billion in Budget 2025)



#### Social Protection & Welfare

RM25 million supports mothers and children assistance through 1. the Endowment Fund Sarawak and maternity assistance, strengthening early childhood wellbeing and family security.



RM55.8 million enhances welfare support, including general aid, 2. youth assistance, child aid, OKU assistance, and disaster relief to protect vulnerable households.



Sumbangan Keperluan Asas Sarawak (SKAS) programme receives 3. RM640 million to provide essential household support and ensure basic needs are met for low-income families across Sarawak.



The Sarawak Rental Assistance Scheme receives RM48 million to 4. ease housing costs, strengthen residential stability, and support vulnerable households across the state.



RM68.6 million strengthens health assistance for vulnerable 5. groups, expanding access to medical support and improving welfare outcomes for underserved communities.



Job creation and income growth initiatives are supported through 6. RM6.3 million, enhancing employment opportunities and improving economic mobility for Sarawakians.



A total of RM121 million will deliver 1,547 affordable housing units 7. across Kuching, Betong, Sibu, Mukah, Bintulu, Miri, and Limbang, expanding homeownership opportunities statewide.



Resettlement schemes receive RM224 million alongside RM50 8. million for the Longhouse Loan Scheme, improving rural infrastructure and upgrading living conditions for longhouse families.



## Rural Development, Utility & Infrastructure

RM199 million advances rural electrification through new electricity 1. projects and alternative funding schemes, expanding reliable power access for remote and underserved communities.



Connection charges and essential utility assistance are supported 2. through RM12 million to reduce household costs and improve access to basic services.



A total of RM1.12 billion strengthens public transportation via 3. KUTS/ART infrastructure, Sarawak Metro operations, and improved conventional services including smart buses and Sibu routes.
